Dog Ordinance

1. When any female dog in season is permitted to roam at large in the village, the owner thereof or the person having custody and control of said dog may be punished by a fine of not more than ten dollars for each offense.

2. When any dog is permitted to roam at large without being accompanied by the owner thereof and causes a nuisance by barking, or causes damage to persons or property, the owner thereof or the person having custody and control of said dog may be punished by a fine of not more than ten dollars for each offense.

3. No person shall own, keep or harbor any dog which by loud, frequent and habitual barking, howling or yelping shall disturb the peace of any person or persons. The owner thereof or persons having custody and control of said dog or dogs shall be punished by a fine of not more than twenty dollars for each offense.

Paragraph #3 amended August 31, 1994 to read:

No person shall own, keep or harbor any dog which by loud, frequent and habitual barking, howling or yelping shall disturb the peace of any person or persons. The owner thereof or persons having custody and control of said dog or dogs shall, upon the first occasion, be given a written warning which shall include the date and time it was issued. Upon conviction of any subsequent violations within a period of six (6) months from such a warning, the person found to be in violation shall be punished by a civil penalty according to the following schedule:

First Offense:	\$25.00
Second Offense:	\$50.00
Third and each Additional Offense:	\$100.00

All fines assessed shall be recovered for the use of the Town of Harrison through district Court.
